 - Risk-Sensitive Capital Regulation
 - Interest Rates
 - Journal Publications
- Research outcomes are also reflected in policy documents such as Inflation Reports, Financial Stability Reports, Analyses of the Czech Republic's Current Economic Alignment with the Euro Area
